1.- INTRODUCTION


Since we first thought about this project, we were sure that this work package was one that would be one of the most complicated to implement, due the complexity of the theme Authentication and Authorization Infrastructure (AAI - Identity Management) and the lack of knowledge and skills in the technical team in the target NRENs.

During the planning phase, we have discovered some heterogeneous environments. There was an NREN that was very interested in the topic, but they lacked the necessary manpower resources to work on it, at the other extreme, there was a NREN that planned to launch an Identity Federation, take it into production and study how to join the eduGAIN interfederation service.

This document will describe the results obtained in AAI implementation in Latin America during the project.

2.- INITIAL SCENARIO

When we have started this work package, we have defined the milestone to start the job; the MoU signed by the NREN's responsible. We thought that doing this we would raise the attention of the project to the member's directors while give the necessary power and support to technical staff to implement a federation. The Figure 1 shows the initial scenario in the beginning of 2013:





As described in "Deliverable D2.1 - Roadmap for the delivery and deployment of National AAIs in Latin America", during the kickoff meeting in Lima, Peru in July, 5th, 2012, three countries were identified as federation startups: Chile, Peru and Colombia. After this date, Mexico and Argentina also expressed interest.

The next section will provide more details on the development of federations in Latin America.

3.- CHILE - THE FEDERATED COMUNITY REUNA (COMUNIDAD FEDERADA REUNA OR COFRE)

Since 2011, REUNA (Red Universitaria Nacional) has been working to establish a Chilean Federation to its partners and clients. In this context, since 2012 CONICYT (Comisión Nacional de Investigación Científica y Tecnológica, <u>http://www.conicyt.cl/</u>), as a founder member of the Corporation Cincel and BEIC (Biblioteca Electrónica de Información Científica - <u>http://www.beic.cl/</u>) Program participant, has adopted the Chilean Federation as central scheme to facilitate access to scientific collections to researchers.

Although work on the Chilean Federation had already begun when the ELCIRA Project started, the WP2 team helped REUNA to transition to production and eventually join eduGAIN.

In September 2013, REUNA has signed the MoU with ELCIRA Project, to cooperate in promoting the establishment and adoption of Identity Federations and additional services based on them (eduroam, eduGAIN, cloud services) in the country. This MoU was a concretion of a work that had been doing since the kick-off meeting in June 2012. In December, 2012, the meeting in Santiago, Chile, has helped to strengthen the relationship between ELCIRA and REUNA even more, so the project team and REUNA technical staff had started to work together in order to make COFRe part of eduGAIN, what was completed on October, 31st, 2013.

The Colombian team in RENATA (Red Nacional Académica de Tecnología Avanzada) had been focused on eduroam implementation initially then started to work on an identity federation. The RENATA IdP was installed, validated, and integrated with active directory, linked to a SP without inconvenience and performing authentication. They have created the Discovery Service and all policies involved to have the Colombian Federation launched. The webpage was created and is available at http://colfire.co/.


Figure 5: eduGAIN status webpage.

6.- ECUADOR - MINGA

MINGA is the Ecuadorian federation for identity management supervised and administrated by CEDIA (Consorcio Ecuatoriano para el Desarrollo de Internet Avanzado), this federation allows Universities, research facilities and CEDIA members to connect and use online services of the federation and others service providers having agreements with CEDIA (thirty party applications like libraries and research advanced services) always using the same identity credentials given by the institution member.

MINGA was not pointed, at the beginning of the project, as a potential federation because the project team have considered that Mexico, Colombia, Argentina and Peru were ahead of Ecuador in Identity Management, however they are very committed in all subjects they join in.




Figure 13: Identity Federation Stages within ELCIRA.
